Equality Ohio Seeking Applicants–Digital Storytelling Workshop

The purpose of the Our Stories Project is to amplify the voices of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and allied Ohioans and educate communities by sharing the truth about who we are as people.

Equality Ohio is accepting applications to participate in an intensive, 3-day workshop (August 21, 22, 23) taught by experts from the Center for Digital Storytelling.

This workshop is an opportunity for you to make a digital story (short video) about your experience as an LGBT or allied Ohioan. Each video will be made by combining your story – written and recorded by you, from your perspective – with still images and music. In order to be selected for this workshop, you must agree to allow your story to be shown online, on television, and in public settings like community centers, colleges, libraries, and theaters or distributed on DVD.

Your story will be used to educate people about what life is like for LGBT Ohioans and to encourage others to get involved in making an Ohio where everyone feels at home. Maximum number of participants is 10. We will maintain a waiting list.

Ohioans from every walk of life and part of the state are encouraged to apply, a few travel scholarships will be made available.

Book Review: Blind Curves—A Blind Eye Mystery



Blind Curves – A Blind Eye Mystery is the first book by Diane Anderson-Minshall and Jacob Anderson-Minshall, and I think they've done a great job!

The lesbian owner of Womyn Magazine and publishing mogul, Rosemary Finney, is found murdered on The Huckleberry Hiking Trail in the Santa Cruz Mountains. Prior to her death, it was rumored that Rosemary had become involved in some “illicit business affairs.” During her life, Rosemary had made a lot of enemies over the years, not only in the publishing field, but also in her personal life.

While this book was a quick and easy read, it was intriguing enough to keep me turning the pages. I was able to visualize the characters and their surroundings as the tale unfolds. The sex scene between Velvet and her girlfriend, Tucker, is stylishly written and will leave the reader begging for more.

The relationships between characters, friends- lovers- ex lovers, are a great set up for future books of this series. By the end of the book, you will want to know what is next for the Blind Eye Detective Agency and how characters will evolve.

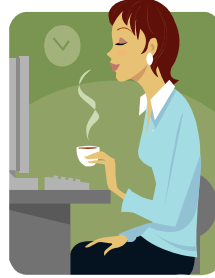

I, too, pass them.

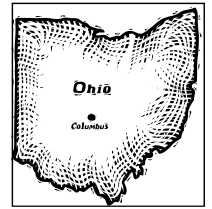
Conversations overheard,
