Central Ohio GLBT Community To Hold Two Political Candidate Forums

Members of the Central Ohio gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community will have two opportunities to meet the political candidates on the ballot in November and ask the questions that are important to our community.

“These forums will give the LGBT community an opportunity to see, hear and evaluate all of the candidates side by side. It will also provide our community an opportunity to educate elected officials and candidates about our concerns and issues,” Karla Rothan, Executive Director of Stonewall Columbus and host to the forums said.

Every candidate for Columbus Mayor, Columbus City Council, Franklin County Municipal Court and Columbus School Board has been invited to attend. Each candidate will be given one minute to introduce themselves, followed by written questions from the audience read by a moderator. Each candidate will be given one minute to answer each question. Finally, each candidate will be given one minute at the end of the forum to offer a final remark. Questions for the candidates can be submitted on the night of each event or in advance by sending the question to thurber1961@aol.com.

The October 3, 2007 forum will feature Columbus Mayoral and City Council candidates and the October 10, 2007 forum will feature Franklin County Municipal Court and Columbus School Board candidates. Both forums will be held on the second floor of Stonewall Columbus, 1160 N. High Street in the Short North. Each forum begins with a reception for the community to meet the candidates one-on-one from 6:30 to 7 p.m. The formal candidate forums will begin promptly at 7 p.m.

These forums are sponsored for the benefit of the GLBT community by HRC, Stonewall Columbus, Stonewall Democrats of Central Ohio and co-sponsored by Equality Ohio, TransOhio, SpeakOUT, OSU GLBT Alumni Society, Outlook Weekly and Out in Columbus.

TransOhio is for all transwomen and transmen and their loved ones in Ohio and beyond. The first TransOhio picnic at Goodale Park in June was a success and there will be many more similar events. I hope you support all such efforts.

As some of you have noticed, for the last two years, I have no longer planned the annual Christmas parties or the pool-side parties that were inclusive of all GDPCO people, friends and families. Our numbers grew such that my home, available parking space and the neighborhood simply could not handle the crowd. Since October '06, our monthly group meetings have been in a nearby church. Most of you know, however, that since last summer, June through September, we end groups in a timely manner and gather at my pool-side to swim, eat and socialize. Some GDPCO graduates who keep in touch have known about them and have come as well. My efforts to have people connected served a purpose for many years but now email, the Internet and TransOhio with its monthly newsletters do this far more effectively. 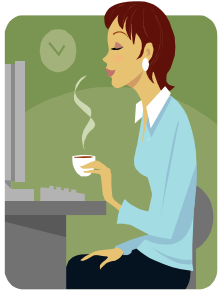

SOFFA Talk – Ask Anna...

My friend's FTM partner recently had his chest reconstruction surgery and she asked if she could share her experience with us...

It's only been about two months since his chest reconstruction surgery and yet it all seems like a blur way back to January when we set the date. I can't give you all of the details about what has happened since that cold day in Cleveland because I didn't take the time to stop and think about it. I can't even imagine what it's been like for him. I'm not sure I want to; there was lots of stress and anxiety and fear then there was pain and blood and more anxiety. But for us, beneath all of that was RELIEF! One giant hill climbed and conquered. I wanted to write about our experience for the SOFFAs of FTM's. As I'm looking back over the past eight months, I can only think of one thing to say about it all:

Be Patient.

Be patient with the timing of things; there's probably never going to be a "perfect" time to have your partner or family member go under the knife. A week before my partner's surgery date my paid credit card bills were stolen out of my mailbox. This not only compromised my credit card accounts but also my checking account which I had used to pay my credit cards. A week before my partner was to undergo major (and extremely expensive) surgery, I had to close all of my credit card accounts as well as my checking and savings accounts and open new ones which I couldn't access right away. There was also less money available to me due to the fraudulent charges. Obviously, despite our best efforts this was not perfect timing. But we kept our plans and moved forward and things worked out just fine.

You and your partner also need to be patient regarding healing. I highly recommend making certain that you or someone you trust is available to your partner twenty-four hours a day for at least three to four days (maybe even up to a week). He was basically immobile the first few days other than trips to and from the bathroom or to and from the bed and couch. Also, pain management requires taking the medication on a regular basis so that the pain doesn't have a chance to come back before the medicine takes effect. Unfortunately, the medicine also can make your partner a little fuzzy in the head, making it impossible to stay consistent on timing. So being there to help them make sure they take their medication on time is a big help!

The results of chest surgery can also take awhile to fully show. Nearly two months after surgery, his incisions have completely closed and most of the swelling is gone, but there are still spots that are very tender and positions he can't lay in for very long. Yet, his activity level is just about normal. He's back at work and can do chores around the house again. I think that when he's at the six month mark, it will be very difficult to even tell he's had surgery at all.

Of course, he's just thrilled that he's had his chest reconstruction and doesn't have to worry about binding or the pain and discomfort associated with it. As for me, I'm glad the surgery is over and all the stress of taking care of everything, including my partner, has passed. Lastly, we're both very glad to be moving on from this point and seeing what the rest of life has to offer us now.

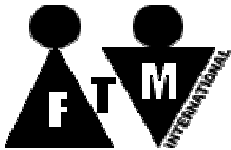

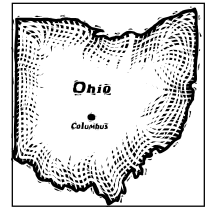
